THE PERRY BELMONT HOUSE

The Order has been an extraordinary steward of the house and its contents, but the residence is now over 110 years old and as such needs further methodical and professional care. Major renovations and upgrades completed are a new heating plant, roof, and elevator.

We are now beginning a major fundraising campaign to address the preservation and restoration of the significant interiors.

These include many opportunities to help us with projects such as restoring the original gold leaf details in many of the rooms, reupholstering silk walls and furniture, recreating appropriate period drapery and cleaning the magnificent oil paintings.



The Order began searching for a suitable International Temple in 1919, at the Nineteenth Triennial Assembly of the General Grand Chapter, and formed a Temple Committee in 1934. The mansion was purchased with contributions from members worldwide. The elaborately carved limestone mansion has many highly ornate rooms with marble floors, fine wood carvings and gilded plaster. It now is well into its second century of existence and the exterior and interior finishes, as well as, mechanical systems are in need of maintenance, repair and restoration.



There have already been significant donations made by Grand Chapters and individuals for the preservation of the headquarters. The generosity of donors is vital in preserving our heritage.
